1.1. Applying the QCAR Framework to Physical Education – Samantha Parry, Principal Education Officer, Q2 Team, Teaching and Learning Branch, Department of Education and Training. This session will use the physical activity organiser as a context for exploring the relationship between the essential learnings, knowledge and understanding, ways of working and assessable elements within the HPE KLA. It will also look at making judgements about the quality of student performance.

1.2 Senior PE Assessment 1: Collecting evidence for making valid decisions – Ron Weatherby, Lockyer District SHS & State Panellist & Russell Jackson, Toowoomba SHS. This session will focus on creating an environment which allows students to demonstrate C3 – Evaluating – from the work program to learning experiences, and assessment. Discussions will take place about what constitutes evidence, the significance and nature of assessment validity, and collecting evidence for making valid decisions.

1.3 “activebods” resources and Gymnastics Foundation Course for Teachers – Lia Weston, *activebods* Resource Development Manager & Kyrn Williams, *activebods* Education and Training Manager. This session will take participants through an *activebods* Take 30 lesson and provide information about *activebod*'s exciting resources and courses available for Teachers.

2.1 Fun Inclusive Physical Activity for All – students, teachers, parents and government agencies – Anthony Ebbage, Managing Director, Kids Sports. This is a practical, hands-on, activity-based session where participants will be shown innovative ways to get even the most reluctant students active and having fun, without even knowing they are exercising. Kids Sports runs fun, vigorous, physical activities which are non-competitive, cooperative and require limited skills, so that everyone can participate. You will also be given ideas for teaching strategies, setting up, risk management, equipment, timetabling, outcomes, and funding ideas for your school's sporting equipment and programs.

2.2 Schools, Sport & Recreation – Getting the most out of each other – Bradley Low, Industry Advisor Qld Fitness, Sport and Recreation Skills Alliance and Caroline Brooks, Vice-President, ACHPER QLD. As Senior Recreation teachers have a choice to deliver the subject using VET, this networking forum provides opportunities for teachers to build contacts with local sport and recreation bodies who may be on the look-out for students to volunteer for various roles. Skills Alliance (formerly Recreation Training Queensland) and ACHPER QLD will present information about the challenges teachers face to deliver the subject, the industry structure, key contacts and peak bodies, as well as examining case studies on how schools and industries can work together to get the most out of each other.

2.3 Using Accelerware for Interactive Learning in HPE – Stewart Briggs, Managing Director, Sports Performance Systems Pty Ltd. This session will show Secondary PE teachers how they can combine face-to-face teaching with online teaching about fitness training programs to get a faster response from their students. Accelerware is an online software tool which can be purchased to support students and teachers design professional fitness programs quickly and easily. It has over 100 strength and conditioning exercises to choose from, some of which participants will experience in this highly practical workshop.

3.1 Change is on the Horizon - The Sport & Recreation Industry – Neal Ames, Senior Advisor, Sport and Recreation Services, South West Region. This session will provide a holistic view of where sport is headed in the medium term with a focus on the changing focus of Sport and Recreation funding, including the new Kids In Care funding program, indigenous sports officers and infrastructure programs. It will also address how the Crawford and Access Economics reviews of sport will change the sporting landscape, as well as look at the Building the Education Revolution (BER) program of building school multi-purpose halls and what this means for the future of community and school sport.

3.2 Senior PE Assessment 2: Considerations for the moderation process – Ron Weatherby, Lockyer District SHS & State Panellist & Russell Jackson, Toowoomba SHS. This session will focus on considerations that Senior PE teachers may make when preparing submissions for the moderation process. This session will follow on from Session 1.2; however, teachers can choose to attend one or both sessions.

3.3 Innovative healthy programs with ARL Development – Col Henschell, National Development Officer, ARL Development. This session will include a presentation indoors and practical activities including a DVD presentation about the “Eat Well Play Well Stay Well” program, the “Learning in League” program and its links to the HPE syllabus and the “Back YARD League” program.
